Dear Members,

As I reflect on my first year as CEO of Eagle Community Credit Union, one thing stands out: the strength of our community. Whether it's through everyday banking, volunteering in local neighborhoods, or hearing your feedback, we've seen how much can be accomplished when we work together. It's been a year of progress, and we're grateful for your continued trust and support.

# Financial Strength and Stability

We've worked hard to ensure Eagle remains financially strong and resilient. Our loan growth is steady, member deposits are increasing, and we're operating well within budget. These metrics are more than numbers—they're a reflection of your trust and our shared commitment to financial wellness. As of this writing (August 2025), our net worth remains strong at 10.31%, loans continue to perform well with a delinquency ratio of 0.44%, and total assets has grown to \$374 million. Eagle is stronger than ever and we're poised to continue on our growth trajectory.

# Eagle CU's Commitment to Community Food Drives



At Eagle Community Credit Union, we believe that financial wellness begins with meeting basic human needs—and that includes access to nutritious food. This past year, our team proudly supported two major food drive initiatives: Stamp Out Hunger and Feed SoCal, helping combat food insecurity across Southern California.

# Stamp Out Hunger: A Tradition of Compassion

Since 2008, Eagle has been a proud sponsor of the **Stamp Out Hunger** food drive, the largest one-day food drive in the nation. Every May, our postal members and volunteers come together to collect and sort donations at local post offices. In 2025, over 65 Eagle team members participated, unloading food donations, supporting local food banks, and connecting with members across Southern California.

We also funded the production of paper grocery bags—750,000 in total—distributed to households across the region to encourage donations. These bags, filled with non-perishable items, were picked up by letter carriers and delivered to food banks, where our volunteers helped sort and pack them for families in need.

# Feed SoCal: A Powerful Partnership

In June, Eagle joined forces with ABC7's Feed SoCal campaign, volunteering at Stater Bros. Markets in Fountain Valley to collect food donations and raise awareness about hunger in our community. During a televised interview, CEO Michael Kim shared:

"We promote financial wellness and we believe that begins with ensuring basic needs are being met." This message resonated deeply with viewers and reinforced our mission to serve not just financially, but holistically.

# The Bigger Picture: Hunger in Our Communities

Food insecurity affects millions of Americans, including 1 in 6 children. It's not just about empty stomachs—it's about missed opportunities, poor health outcomes, and the stress of not knowing where your next meal will come from. That's why Eagle's involvement in food drives is more than a volunteer effort—it's a commitment to dignity, equity, and care.

# Beyond the Drives

Our community engagement doesn't stop there. Eagle team members also support:

- Ronald McDonald House and CHOC (Children's Hospital of Orange County) through fundraising and volunteer events.
- Second Harvest Food Bank, where employees helped sort and bag over 4,000 lbs. of fresh produce for local families.
- Spark of Love Toy Drive is coming soon in December and Eagle will again be collecting toys for children across Southern California making it a brighter holiday season.
